



The International Exhibition of Inventions Geneva has confirmed its global reputation and celebrated the next generation of inventors

Grand Prix, young talent and a great turnout: the [51st International Exhibition of Inventions Geneva](#) has closed its doors on a successful 2026 edition, despite the uncertain context.

The 2026 edition of the International Exhibition of Inventions Geneva recorded over 30,000 entries. The public was able to discover [over 1,000 inventions](#) presented by participants from 35 countries and regions. Despite an uncertain international context, exhibitors showed exemplary commitment to joining the Exhibition, confirming its importance and unique role on the international scene of invention and innovation.

The Grand Prix of this 51st edition was awarded to the Hong Kong company The Oasis ONE for its sustainable aquaculture process. The invention combines genetics, biosecurity and optimised water management to enable healthier, more sustainable and better-controlled fish farming.

This year's event also saw the launch of the [Youth Lab](#) and its new 'Inventeur-rices de demain - Young Talents' competition, dedicated to students aged 4 to 18. The winner, Aljawharah Alqahtani from Saudi Arabia, took the Grand Prix in the junior competition with PulMind, a project that uses artificial intelligence to help doctors better monitor respiratory diseases, detect risks earlier and adapt treatments.

The workshops and activities offered in the Youth Lab area were a resounding success, enabling young visitors aged 4 and over to learn about science, innovation and creativity in a fun, participatory setting.

The [Swiss Pavilion](#), meanwhile, provided an ideal platform for showcasing Swiss innovation. The humanoid robot Nadine attracted a great deal of interest, as did a lecture by explorer Raphaël Domjan. Present throughout the weekend, Swiss startups were able to meet a curious and receptive public.
